Running over the Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays in June, the Angus & Dundee Gardeners are offering an opportunity to visit 17, not previously opened, gardens across Angus and Dundee.

Our trail offers a flexible way to keep up your weekly dose of beautiful gardens, and excellent value for money. These gardens are all new to SGS and run from the west end of Dundee to the coast around Arbroath, over through Forfar to Edzell and down to Meigle. Visit a community garden, productive walled garden, as well as 13 further private gardens of varying sizes and styles. The Dundee Botanic Garden will promote the trail with entry to trail ticket holders over the first weekend. Maggie's Dundee garden will also be available to visit throughout the trail.

A ticket for the Angus & Dundee Garden Trail makes a perfect gift, and treat yourself as well!

CHARITY



2 WHITEWALLS FARM COTTAGE

off Emmock Road, by Tealing, Dundee DD3 0QE

Whitewalls is a garden in a rural setting created by the owner over the last four years as a series of interlinked garden rooms. The garden is set in three-quarters of an acre with a range of plants and trees including acers, azaleas and rhododendrons and a large variety of perennials and shrubs, some which are unusual. The features include a Japanese-inspired garden with a Koi pond, granite lanterns and a tea house. There is a winter garden and a formal garden with long perennial border. The garden also features a wildlife pond with shade-loving plants and a stream. There is also a productive small polytunnel and fruit garden. The garden is accessible to most with a few steps and easy slopes.

Directions: Off the A90 just north of Dundee at Struan's roundabout heading towards the Black Watch memorial on Emmock Road. Emmock Road will then pass over the A90 and the garden is the first turning on the right, about two miles after the flyover. Please be aware that parking is limited and down an unadopted drive.

Open: Fridays and Saturdays in June, 2pm – 5pm







5 GLAMIS PLACE

Il Gardino de Giovanni, Dundee DD2 1NB John Egan

Il Gardino de Giovanni is a terraced south-facing garden with excellent views. It includes a border garden, wildlife garden, and with numerous pots scattered throughout the garden along with seating.

Directions to Glamis Place: Off Glamis Terrace, off Glamis Road. Buses 73 and 22 - Blackness Road/Glamis stop and buses 5 and 16 -Perth Road and Invercarse Hotel.

Open: Saturdays in June, 11am - 4pm

6 GLAMIS PLACE

Dundee DD2 1NB Jim and Janet Paterson

A small garden with very many interesting plants, borders around the garden walls, raised beds and planters. A variety of shrubs and small trees give structure to the underplanting of bulbs, alpines and woodland-loving plants covering all seasons. Snowdrops, corydalis erythronium in spring through summer with species paeonies, podophyllum, ferns, rosacea and much more.

Directions: Same as above.

Open: Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays in June 9am - 6pm





8 LEEMOUNT LANE

Broughty Ferry DD5 1LA Hannah Anthony

This is a compact residential garden secluded and sheltered by large trees. There is a pond, hens, vegetables, herbs, fruit and flowers. There is also a small chamomile lawn and mirrors are used to reflect light. The garden is ideal for young children to explore the paths, look for frogs and feed the hens and includes child-friendly vegetable labels.

Directions: The garden is at the end of the cul-de-sac, there is ample parking at the east end of Dawson Park. Grove Road bus stop on Strathern Road is nearest bus.

BALHARY WALLED GARDEN

Balhary, Alyth, Blairgowrie PH11 8LT

This walled garden is being lovingly restored back to full production with the gardener's cottage gardens being transformed from concrete and grass to a magical, therapeutic hidden gem. The walled garden features 75 varieties of fruit trees lining avenues with new trees being planted. A large herbaceous border (*photo on the leaflet cover*) springs from the lavender hedges to the height of the walls. Vegetables of heritage and new varieties are grown extensively to supply 'foodies'. The cottage garden comes into its own with lighting, living flame, Zen, formal planting and a fairy garden with red squirrels frolicking about. There are quiet seating places to take in the beautiful and serene water features and sooth the soul. Tea, coffee and cake will be available to purchase.

Directions: Situated between Alyth and Meigle off the B954 opposite the sign to *Jordonstone*.

Open: Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays in June 3pm - 8pm



DAMSIDE COTTAGE

Leysmill, Arbroath DD11 4RR Arthur Blair

This cottage garden is set in farmland, overlooking an old dam. It used to be two cottages and a byre and it was converted into one house. The garden once featured in early television garden shows and has evolved over the years as its owners have changed. Today the framework of the original garden remains in the abundant plantings. It is surrounded by dry stone walls and faces south. There is a small pond, area of raised beds with cutting flowers, wonderful espalier fruit trees on house walls, roses, herbaceous beds, scree planting on two low drystane walls and interesting trees. There is a beautiful example of a Tibetan cherry in the main garden.

Directions: Take Leysmill turn off from B965. Turn left at phone box. Fork left at Leysmill Farm. Continue over crossroads. *Damside* is signed on the right side of the road.

Open: Thursdays in June 10am - 2pm







DUNDEE BOTANIC GARDEN

Riverside Drive, Dundee DD2 1QH (University of Dundee)

Visit the University of Dundee Botanic Garden and enjoy its wide range of plants, with fine collections of conifers and broad-leaved trees and shrubs, tropical and temperate glasshouses, water garden and herb garden. Located in nine-and-a-half hectares of southfacing, gently sloping land near the banks of the River Tay, the garden features many species of indigenous British plants as well as representative collections of important plants from all the continents of the world.

Directions: Situated off Riverside Drive along the Tay and on the outskirts of Dundee's City Centre. Signposted from the roundabout near Dundee's International Airport and approximately 330 yards on your right-hand side.

Open: Trail ticket holders are welcome to visit free of charge on Thursday 4th, Friday 5th June and Saturday 6th 10am - 7pm.





FORFAR OPEN GARDEN

36 Lochside Road, Forfar DD8 3JD Forfar Open Gardeners

This is an accessible garden with a garden room and toilet facilities, situated near Forfar Loch. It is open to everyone for visits and plant sales as well as volunteering. The garden will be in its fourth growing year in 2020. We are specialising in growing herbaceous perennials. We are also developing a potager garden. The garden is at the bottom of a south-facing slope and its walls and the trees opposite make it feel peaceful. The aim of the garden is to bring people together to share skills and build connections through creating and looking after the garden. Our focus is to develop opportunities for intergenerational work and mentoring. The relationship between people and plants is at the core of what we do. There is a real well as the garden is on the site of a brewery. There is a small area of woodland with old apple and plum trees.

Directions: Situated opposite Guthrie Park, turning off the A926 opposite Tesco. Bus 117, the Town Service and Foresterseat Circular, operated by JP Minicoaches, stops outside front door.

Open: Saturdays in June 10am - 2:30pm



LAWTON HOUSE

Inverkeilor, by Arbroath DD11 4RU

Katie and Simon Dessain

The 1755 house of red sandstone is approached through beech woods and pasture. Pleached lime trees form a screen on arriving and a path laid with sets and pebble mosaic leads to the front steps, bordered by clipped hawthorn and underplanted with alliums. The borders in front of the house are a mixture of herbaceous perennials, roses and shrubs in varying shades of soft grey. In front is a lawn enclosed by a 'haha' looking onto a meadow of grazing cattle with swallows swooping low. The lawn is pierced by a Maltese flower cross planted with varying coloured stemmed dogwood, bergenias, sage and thyme which looks good in all seasons. A short walk takes you to the walled garden. This is planted with a double cross of apple, pear and plum trees, vegetables and fruit bushes quartering the garden. Two of the walls support roses and wide mixed herbaceous borders. Between the apple trees are clipped yew punctuation marks.

Directions: Take B965 between Inverkeilor and Friockheim, turn right at sign for *Angus Chain Saws*. Drive approximately 200 yards, then take first right.

Open: Thursdays in June 10am - 2pm







MAGGIE'S DUNDEE

Ninewells Hospital, Tom McDonald Ave, Dundee DD2 1NH www.maggiescentres.org/our-centres/maggies-dundee/

The garden at Maggie's Dundee was created in 2005, designed by the renowned landscape gardener Arabella Lennox-Boyd. The stepped earthworks act both to screen and link the building to the hospital, creating a natural amphitheatre. The centrepiece is a 33-metre labyrinth designed as a place where visitors can come to find a space for contemplation and meditation. A separate small garden, surrounded by roses and scented shrubs and plants, is set aside for private contemplation. Paths, planted with both native and more exotic trees chosen for their flower or autumn colour, make access to the centre easier. Through the design plants have been used to delight both the eye and the senses throughout the year and to complement the beauty of the building and its setting.

Directions: Located in the grounds of Ninewells Hospital, near the arboretum.

Open: The garden is available to visit at any time.





MAINS OF BALGAVIES

Forfar DD8 2TH

Georgie and Tom Sampson

The owners established a species-rich wildflower meadow, in about 2008, which has developed into a wonderful wildlife haven, particularly for butterflies and insects. There is a mass of yellow rattle, oxide daisies, varieties of vetch, broad leaf plantain and different clovers as well as some cowslips earlier in the season and later on lots of common knap weed. It is next to a small orchard which now has lots of yellow rattle under the trees. The garden has three mixed herbaceous borders around the walls and in the middle, raised beds where a variety of annuals and lots of delphiniums grow.

Directions: Take the A932 out of Forfar on the Arbroath road and after about four miles after Balgavies Loch there is a left-hand sign to *Brechin* and *Pitkennedy*. Take that left-hand turn, go over the old railway bridge and the house is the next turn on the left signed *Mains of Balgavies*.

Open: Thursdays in June 2pm - 5pm

MILLDEN OF STRACATHRO

Brechin DD9 7QF Alison and Hugh Campbell Adamson

The garden was created around twenty years ago by the present owners. It is approximately half an acre and consists of herbaceous borders surrounded by yew hedges, shrubs, a large pond and lawns running down to the bank of the Cruick river. Part of the house was the original mill building and the pond was made by opening up the mill lade again, to allow water to flow in under the bridge and back into the river under the weeping willow tree. The main part of the bridge is Victorian and was salvaged, restored and erected five years ago. There are rhododendrons and azaleas alongside mature trees and shrubs. The herbaceous borders contain a mix of perennials and roses and steps lead up to a pergola, which is covered in a mixture of honeysuckle, clematis and roses.

Directions: Take the Inchbare turn off the A90 and follow this road for about half a mile. Cross a small bridge and then with a beech hedge in front of you, turn right towards Stracathro Church. Pass the church and go through gates and follow the drive down to the house.

Open: Fridays in June 10am - 2pm







NORTH LODGE

36 Church Street, Edzell DD9 7TQ Robin McIntosh and Paul Thomson

North Lodge was designed by James Salmon in the Arts and Crafts style and built as a summer home in 1906. The current garden was designed and planted up in the last 15 years but has grown up quickly. It is predominantly a semi-evergreen woodland garden, full of mature trees and shrubs, which act as a good backdrop for a multitude of climbers and herbaceous perennials. June is a beautiful time of year for this garden, with numerous flowering azaleas, rhododendrons and spring bulbs. The garden also has a Japanese element to it, which has been included to reflect original design features inside the house itself. Pots of acers and bamboo thrive within the protected walled environment, ferns share a shady area with our collection of snowdrops, and a still pond reflects both the sky and plants around it. Our current focus is on increasing the wildlife elements, the pond is loved by birds and a bed of plants specifically chosen for pollinators proved very successful in 2019. Red squirrels and pheasants visit regularly, and we have many varieties of nesting birds owing to the excellent number of trees, shrubs and around cover.

Directions: Take the A90 to B966 signposted to *Edzell*. Continue through the town to the roundabout at the end and take the first exit (left) to Lethnot Road. North Lodge is on the corner of Lethnot Road and Church Street.

Open: Fridays in June noon - 4pm





RESWALLIE HOUSE

Forfar DD8 2SA Caroline and Hugh Graham Watson

Reswallie is an attractive Georgian mansion house built in 1794 and set in pretty woodland and pasture which extends down to the shores of Rescobie Loch. There are many mature and significant tree species here including metasequoia, a pseudo-Camellia japonica, and a fine English oak planted on the south front in 1937 to commemorate the coronation of King George VI and Queen Elizabeth. The charming walled flower and vegetable gardens flank the east side of the house. The flower garden features two delightfully informal and abundant herbaceous borders with a fine collection of old-fashioned roses and delphiniums. The central pergola in the main border lends height and structure with a tumble of honeysuckle and clematis. Pebblelined gravel pathways and an extensive Victorian greenhouse edge the borders and main lawn. The adjacent vegetable garden and orchard is neatly planted with raised beds set out between box-lined pathways. The memorial primula garden, planted in 2014 on the slopes of the main driveway, features over 40 species, as well as a significant variety of poppies and lilies. Also, of interest, are the cup and ring Pictish stones installed near the old well.

Directions: Take the A932 from Forfar and signposted to *Arbroath*. Continue about three miles and turn left signposted to *Reswallie*. Reswallie House is the first right.

Open: Thursdays in June 2pm – 5pm



ST BRIDE'S COTTAGE

South Kingennie, Broughty Ferry DD5 3PA Alison and Donald Gordon

This half-acre garden was started from scratch in 2002 and now provides year-round interest. Planting several trees and making a wildlife pond and stream were the first priorities, as birds were sadly rare visitors to the garden. Parts of the perimeter of the garden are left semi-wild with dense shrubs to provide cover and nesting areas, while the area visible from the house is planted for viewing, with a mixture of shrubs, perennials and bulbs. Some features are inspired by visits to gardens around the world, including a Japanese-themed area with island bed. There is a small bog garden with a lovely early summer display of *Iris sibirica* and many plants justify their existence by attracting a wide variety of bees and butterflies.

Directions: From Kellas take the minor road signposted *Murroes Church* for approximately one mile to some steading houses and turn left up farm track immediately before them. St Bride's is the first house on the left with conservatory and solar panels. Alternatively from Dobbies head north on Ethiebeaton Road. Turn left at the T junction then first right signposted *Murroes Church* and the track is immediately after the steading houses. There is a sign for *St Bride's* on the low wall of the house at the bottom of the track. The postcode takes you to the steading houses if using SatNav.

Open: Fridays and Saturdays in June 1pm - 5pm





TEMPLETON HOUSE GARDEN

Arbroath DD11 4QP Moira Coleman

This garden is set around a 15-year-old house in farmland and created in a farmyard where pigs used to live! This was a bare site and has evolved since the house was built. It is south-facing and protected by a dry-stone wall and beech hedges. It consists of a mixed border, a rose parterre with developing topiary, a raised bed vegetable and herb garden and a small orchard and fruit garden.

Directions: From the A933 running between Arbroath and Brechin, take the turn towards Leysmill. Look for the old signpost to *Templeton*. Continue on farm track for 500m through farmyard and past old farmhouse. Templeton House is then on the right, a white house with a five-bar gate.

Open: Thursdays in June 10am - 2pm





THE DOOCOT

Kinloch, Meigle, Blairgowrie PH12 8QX Liz and George McLaren

The house and garden sit in a level two-acre site with open views to the Sidlaws and Grampians. The house is a converted 18c steading with a large doo'cot tower, completed in 2009. Garden development began in 2013 with a single row of flowering cherries and formation of two small mixed herbaceous beds, and expanded in 2014 with the creation of a parterre rose garden, and the addition of substantial shrub and herbaceous twin beds and areas of heather and hard planting including rhododendrons, azaleas and a variety of trees. In 2019 the lower half of the south garden was further developed by linking some trees and rhododendron to create seated areas and small themed beds (miniature conifers; ligularia and kniphofia; agapanthus, ferns and viburnum; astilbe and sedum; hydrangea etc) to provide interest later in the summer. The highlights in this young, varied and expanding garden are the rose garden to the front and the pink Japanese dogwood (Cornus kousa 'Miss Satomi') in the back garden which flowers beautifully in early summer.

Directions: Approximately two miles west of Meigle on the A94 (towards Coupar Angus). Just before the hamlet of Longleys there is a turning to the right with a small lodge with red eaves on the roadside. Turn up that tarmac road and The Doocot is 400 yards on the right.

Open: Saturdays in June 2pm - 5pm
