

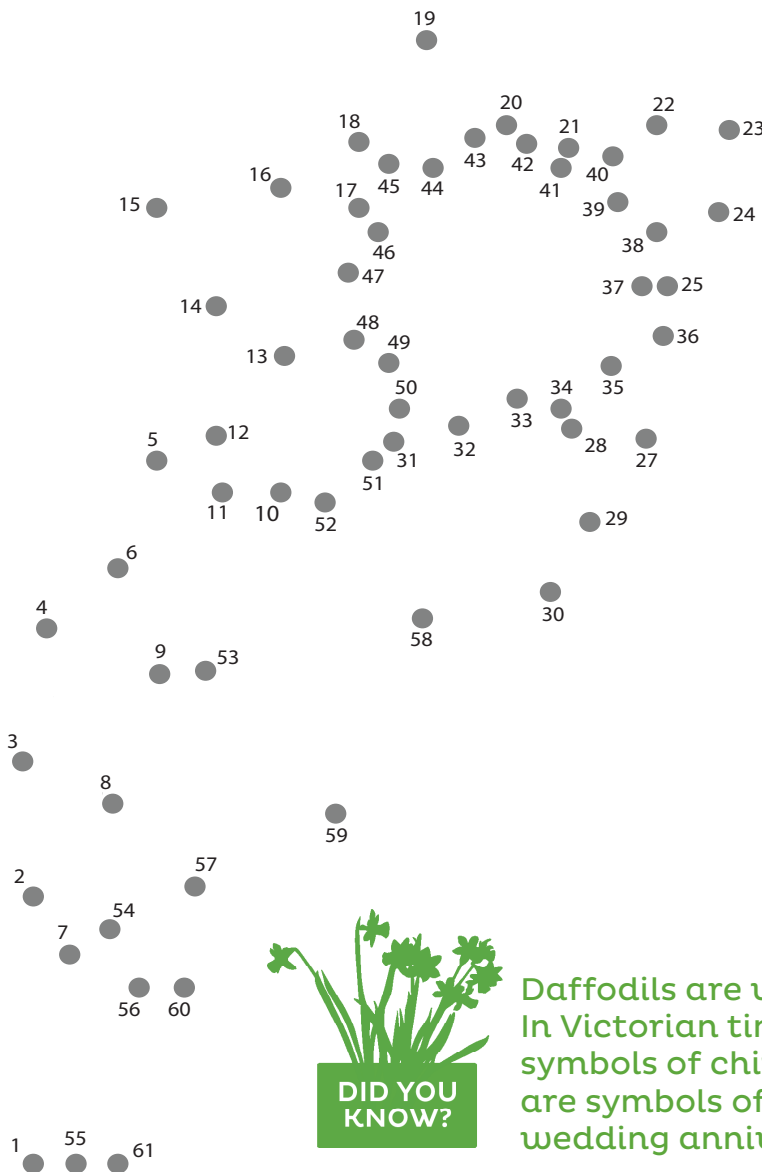
DAFFODILS

Dot-to-dot: What shape is hiding in the numbers?



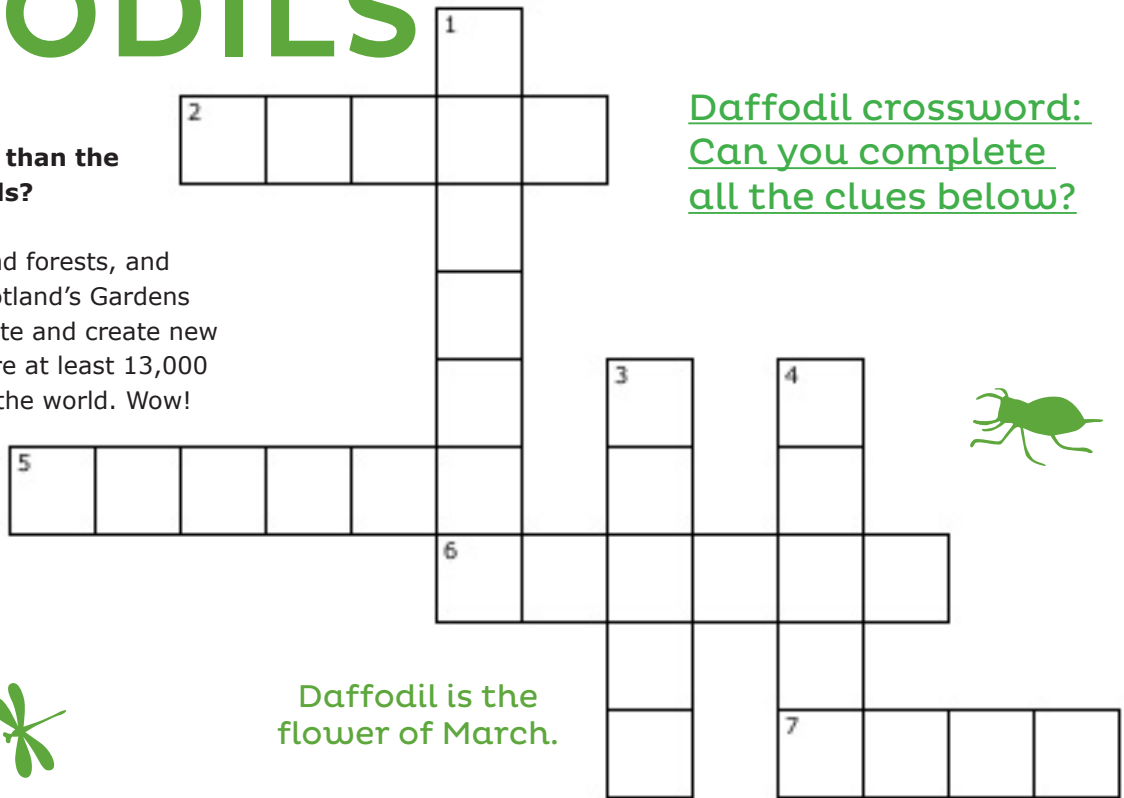
DID YOU KNOW?
